Members must achieve 30 points for Induction.

Any combination of points can be used as long as the total is 30. Members are responsible for tracking their own points and will be expected to show proof of points achieved by July 31

Participate in school dance team/program 2 points Participate in non-competitive dance performance 5 points Participate in dance convention 5 points Attend a live dance performance 5 points Participation in Choreography Showcase 5 points Stage tech/crew for a dance performance 2 points Participate in a summer intensive 10 points

Community

Assist/mentor younger dance students 5 points Volunteer for a studio event 2 points Volunteer at a non-studio community service event 2 points Advocate for dance in the community 2 points

Academic

Receive academic award at your school 5 points Achieve honor roll/dean's list at your school 5 points Maintain GPA higher than 3.5 for the school year 10 points (Min GPA of 3.0 is required for membership)
